

As of January 28, 2012, the City of Dana Point has no record of having received notification of this action. Yet, our City lies at the downstream end of San Juan Creek and the draft EIS identified dam failure and inundation of downstream areas as a potential result of the flood surge.

Similarly we received no FERC notice of the Draft EIS, but sent a letter of concern dated February 16, 2007, to which no response was received. Similarly, no notice was received by our sister downstream city of San Juan Capistrano. No notice was received regarding FERC action on the draft EIS either. He

A concerned citizen notified us of this latest action just yesterday, two days before the end of the comment period.

In trying to research this issue today I left a message for Mr. Jim Fargo who was not available. I also went to the website to glean information as specified in your November 29, 2011 Notice and no information would come up when I entered the docket number P-14227-000, either in the general search or in the docket search sections is.

As you can imagine, this is disconcerting to say the least. While the answer may be that there is no real danger to the City of Dana Point or San Juan Capistrano, how would we know?

Please have Mr. Fargo contact me and give us a chance to review appropriate information and provide a follow on response before taking any action.
